



## AAUW Arlington Representative to Advisory Council on Instruction (ACI) Sought

ACI is an advisory body to the Arlington County School Board, comprised of representatives from all of Arlington's schools and programs, as well as a few community organizations selected specifically by the School Board. AAUW is one of those organizations chosen by the School Board, but somehow, in the past few years, the arrangement has lapsed, and we do not currently have a representative on the ACI.

Current chairs of the ACI are Dana Milburn and Rebecca Hunter, who have reached out to us as they work to have full representation on the ACI.

The mission of the ACI is to provide the School Board with community input and feedback for instructional planning in the school system. The ACI representatives include one from each elementary school, two from each secondary school, plus the representatives from community organizations. The ACI is in turn advised by curricular/subject-matter advisory committees.

## AAUW at the Virginia Assembly

Update on the ERA. After Virginia voted to ratify the Equal Rights Amendment, it went back to the House of Representatives. Here is an excerpt from the report from Virginia AAUW on what happened there:

On February 10 the U.S. House of Representatives voted on a resolution to nullify the deadline to ratify the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) following [Virginia](#) becoming the 38th state to ratify the amendment last month. Currently, the National Archives and Records Administration is refusing to certify the ERA due to a U.S. Department of Justice [opinion](#) declaring the amendment invalid because it was not ratified during the initial window set by Congress. [Shilpa Phadke](#), vice president of the Women's Initiative at the Center for American Progress, released the following statement: Today's vote marks an exciting step toward ensuring that the ERA can officially become part of our nation's Constitution. This vote reflects both [the will of the people](#) and the fundamental importance of enshrining equality regardless of sex in our nation's founding document.

Susan Burke reported on plans for the lobby day on Feb.12, but as of our newsletter deadline we did not have a report. Here is what was proposed.

Because Lobby Day was at crossover time, [the date when bills are passed from the House to the Senate and Senate to House] AAUW was not able to arrange a meeting with a member of the House leadership. Consequently, we visited individual legislators to distribute copies of the new AAUW 2020 Gender Policy Agenda.

If you would like to visit your own representatives, it is recommended that you contact the office in advance to try to make an appointment. (FYI: Susan and Leslie will be visiting Sen. Creigh Deeds [on Feb. 12] to discuss pay equity.)

If you have particular concerns about Virginia legislation, please contact your Delegate or Senator asap to express your views.
